

Testing Information for EATO

If you are a student, professional, or institutional representative in need of testing services, The Educational Advising and Testing Office (EATO) can help you. EATO serves as representative of the [Educational Testing Service](#) (ETS) in Syria, and administers tests on behalf of other organizations as well.

Some of the tests that we administer include the following:

- **TOEFL** : English language proficiency for academic study
- **TSE**: The Test of Spoken English.
- **GRE**: General and Subject tests for graduate study
- **SAT**: Reasoning and Subject tests for undergraduate study
- **ITP**: (Institutional TOEFL) English language; ideal for institutions interested in academic proficiency
- **TOEIC**: English language; ideal for institutions interested in workplace proficiency

Other Tests Offered Outside of Syria

The USMLE, GED, GMAT, and CMA tests are not currently administered within Syria. They are available at centers where computer-based testing facilities are operating.

Where to get a TOEFL bulletin?

The EATO office in Damascus maintains a supply of test bulletins with all pertinent information about the TOEFL, including the registration form. Information on the exam content and registration procedures is available at the [TOEFL Web site](#).

Where and when can I take the TOEFL?

The TOEFL exam is administered in a paper-based format in Syria at both the Damascus Community School in Damascus and the ICARDA International School in Aleppo.

If the below PBT test dates are not convenient for you , or you need to take the test sooner than the available PBT test dates, you can take the Internet Based Test (IBT) in neighboring countries (Jordan or Lebanon).

How do I register to take the TOEFL in Syria?

You can register online for the test. Test-takers need to have access to the internet and an international credit card to register for the paper-based test online at the [TOEFL Web site](#). The registration fee is \$150. Note that when you register at the web site, it is necessary to provide a postal address to which scores can be mailed from the United States.

How do I prepare for the TOEFL?

It is important for you to be familiar with the kinds of questions asked on the TOEFL. There are several ways to prepare.

- Take TOEFL prep courses.

Delayed or Missing TOEFL Score Reports

Questions about any missing score reports should be directed to Educational Testing Service (ETS), the nonprofit organization that develops TOEFL and issues score reports. An e-mail sent to the ETS customer service address toefl@ets.org usually will receive a response in five to seven days. Test takers should wait at least eight weeks before contacting ETS about score reports. Score report problems are best avoided by careful preparation of the registration form.

What is the TOEIC test?

The Test of English for International Communication (TOEIC) is a two-hour English language proficiency examination for people whose native language is not English. It includes 200 multiple-choice questions divided into two sections:

- Listening Section: 100 questions with audiocassette. Statements, questions, short conversations, and short talks in English are followed by questions. This section lasts approximately 45 minutes.
- Reading Section: 100 questions. You will read a variety of materials and respond at your own pace to questions about their content. This section takes about 75 minutes.

The TOEIC is designed to indicate how well people can communicate in English with others in the workplace. It does not require specialized knowledge or vocabulary beyond that of a person who uses English in everyday work activities. The TOEIC examinee handbook has further details on test content.

Registration for ITP and TOEIC

The [ITP](#) examination is based on past editions of paper-based TOEFL tests and designed as an assessment and learning tool for intermediate and advanced students of English, while the [TOEIC](#) test measures English proficiency for the international workplace.
